
Three things we can all do to help end new HIV infections among children by 2015



1. Get the facts



Each year about 390 000 children become newly infected with HIV.

And as many as 42 000 women living with HIV die from complications relating to HIV and pregnancy each year. In contrast, the number of new HIV infections among children and maternal deaths related to HIV in high-income countries is virtually zero.

Why the difference? In low- and middle-income countries, too few women receive HIV prevention and treatment services to protect themselves and their children.

In 2011, world leaders at the United Nations committed to ending new HIV infections in children by 2015 while saving mothers' lives. A bold new global plan was adopted and action is underway in all parts of the world—to increase access and equity.





2. Send a message
