Action required at this meeting – the Programme Coordinating Board is invited to: *elect* officers for the period 1 January to 31 December 2018 and to *approve* the composition of the PCB NGOs.

- 1. In accordance with the Modus Operandi of the Programme Coordinating Board (paragraph 22), the Board is expected to elect from among its members, and States elected as members as of 1 January 2018, a Chair, a Vice-Chair and a Rapporteur.
