6	The same questions (Q4 and Q5) apply to the occasional special reports.	Thank you for your interest.  The occasional special reports are meant to be used for non-for-profit purpose and are requested by and to be delivered to the designated UNAIDS staff members only.
7	Is the full report supposed to be sent solely as an e-mail, or will the report also be available as a webpage? In which case, will the page be for public or private access (as in Q4 above)?	Thank you for your interest.  The full report is meant to be used for non-for-profit use and delivered to designated UNAIDS staff members only.
8	Our company is ISO 9001 certified, as are our partners in Spain, and the UK (they are all members of an international network of ISO 9001-certified translation companies). The Russian company is an accredited member of LISA (the Localization Industry Standards Association), but is not ISO 9001-certified. Would this make us ineligible to reply to the RFP?
