### **Number of people living with HIV**

Total	33.3 million [31.4 million–35.3 million]
Adults	30.8 million [29.2 million–32.6 million]
Women	15.9 million [14.8 million–17.2 million]
Children (<15 years)	2.5 million [1.6 million–3.4 million]

### **People newly infected with HIV in 2009**

Total	2.6 million [2.3 million–2.8 million]
Adults	2.2 million [2.0 million–2.4 million]
Children (<15 years)	370 000 [230 000–510 000]

### **AIDS deaths in 2009**

Total	1.8 million [1.6 million–2.1 million]
Adults	1.6 million [1.4 million–1.8 million]
Children (<15 years)	260 000 [150 000–360 000]

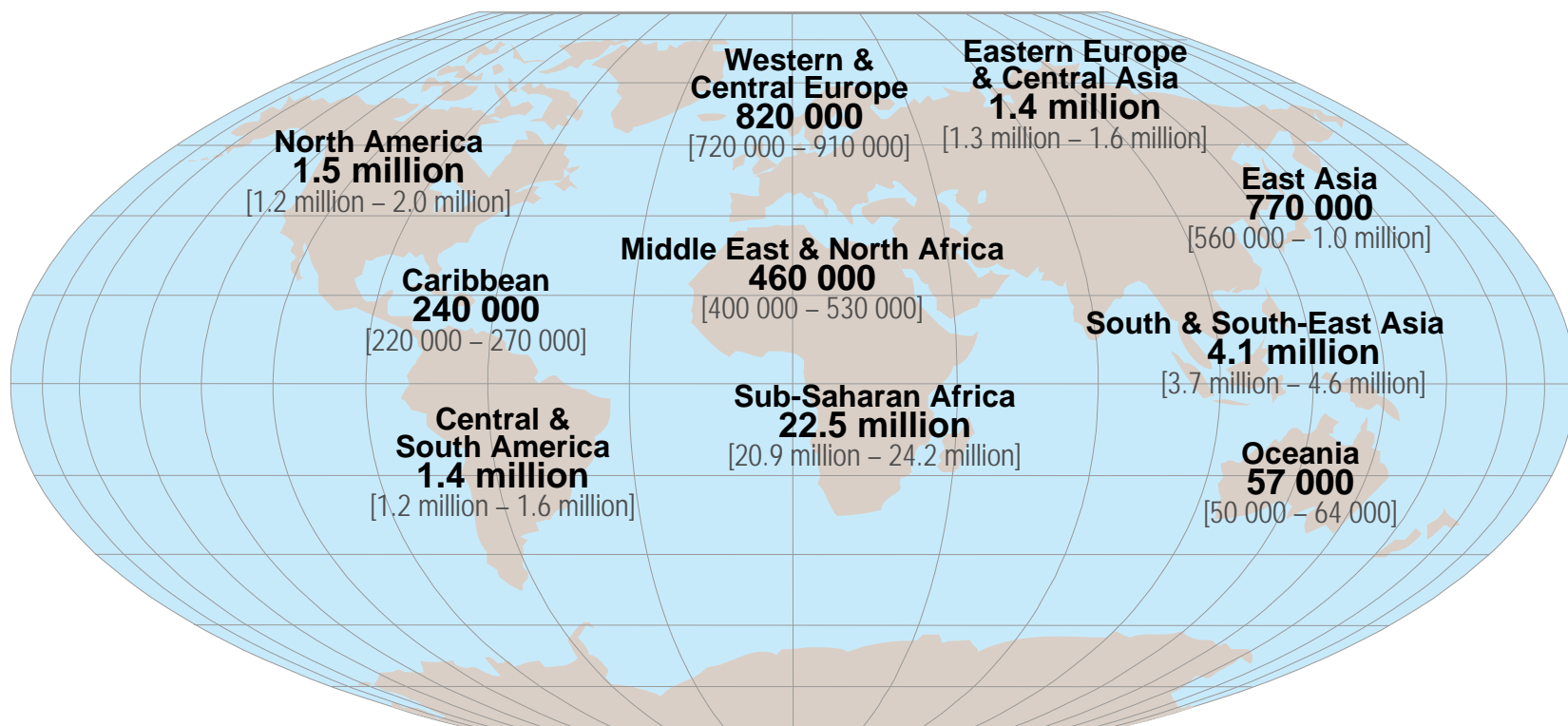

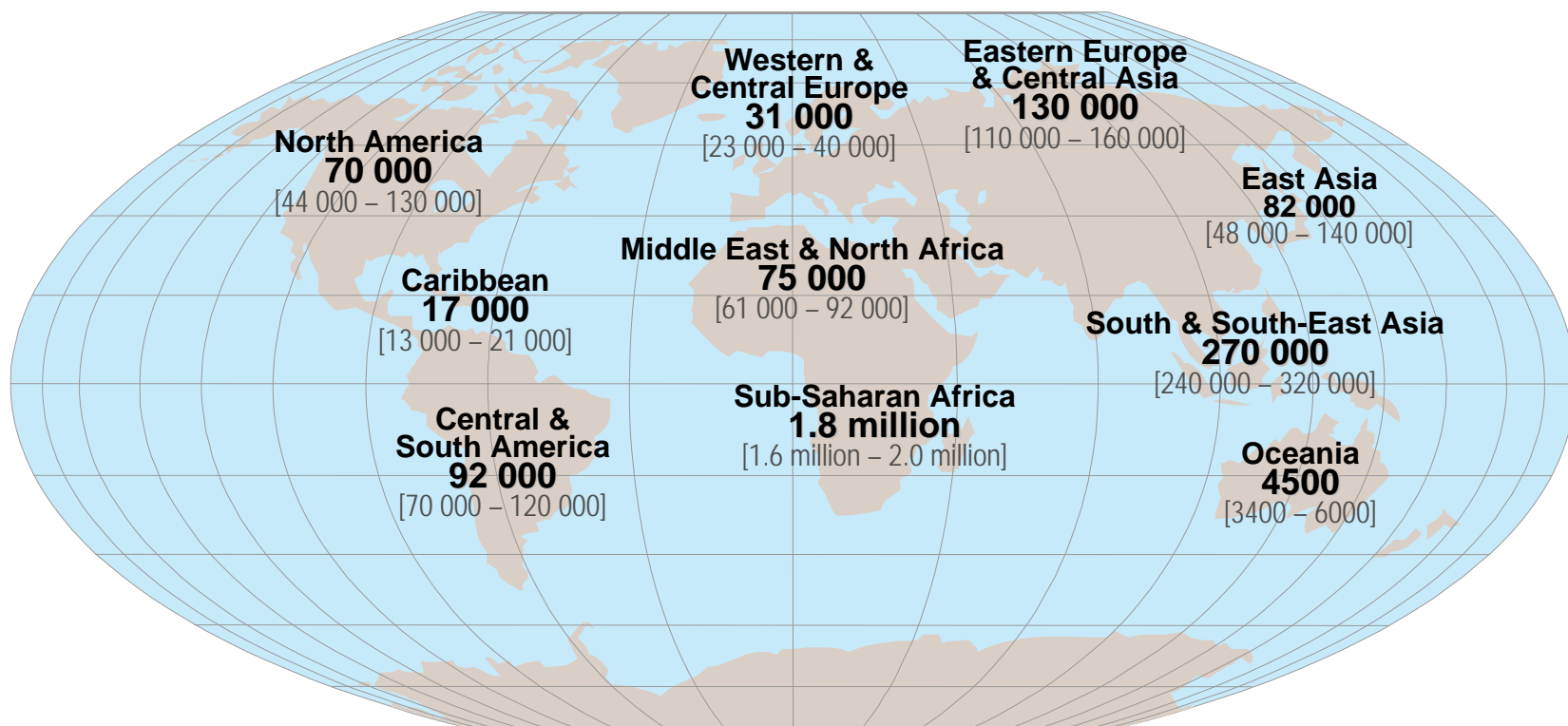
## Adults and children estimated to be living with HIV | 2009

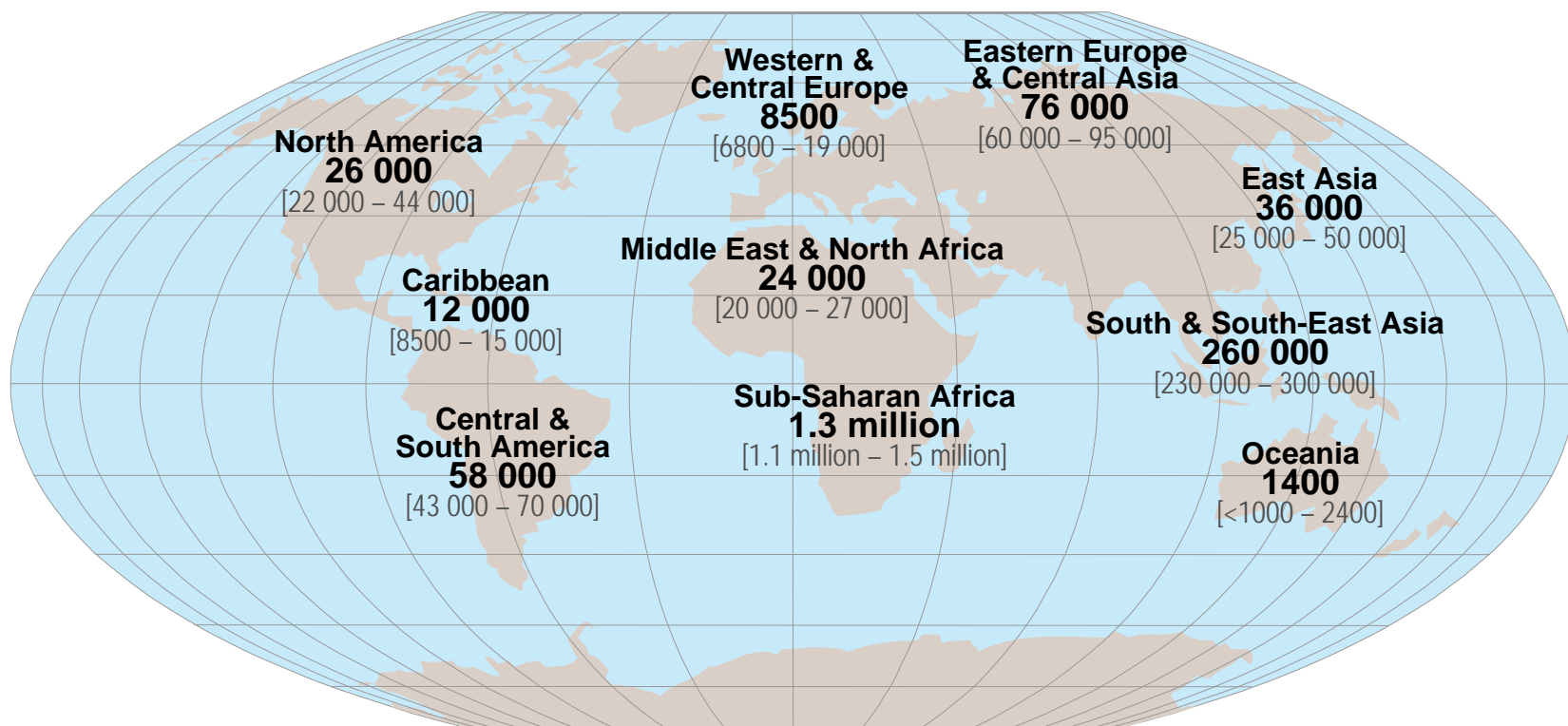

# Estimated number of adults and children newly infected with HIV | 2009



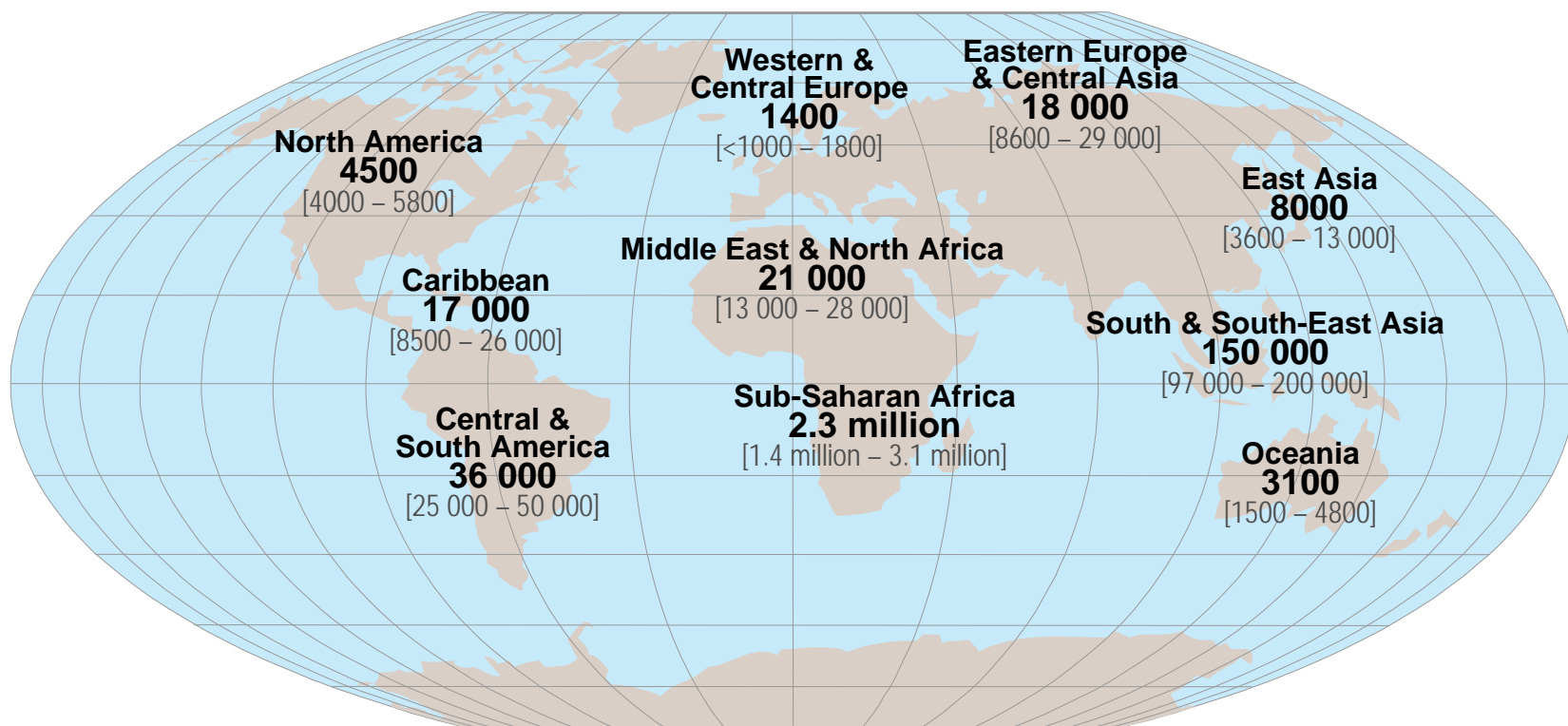

## Children (<15 years) estimated to be living with HIV | 2009

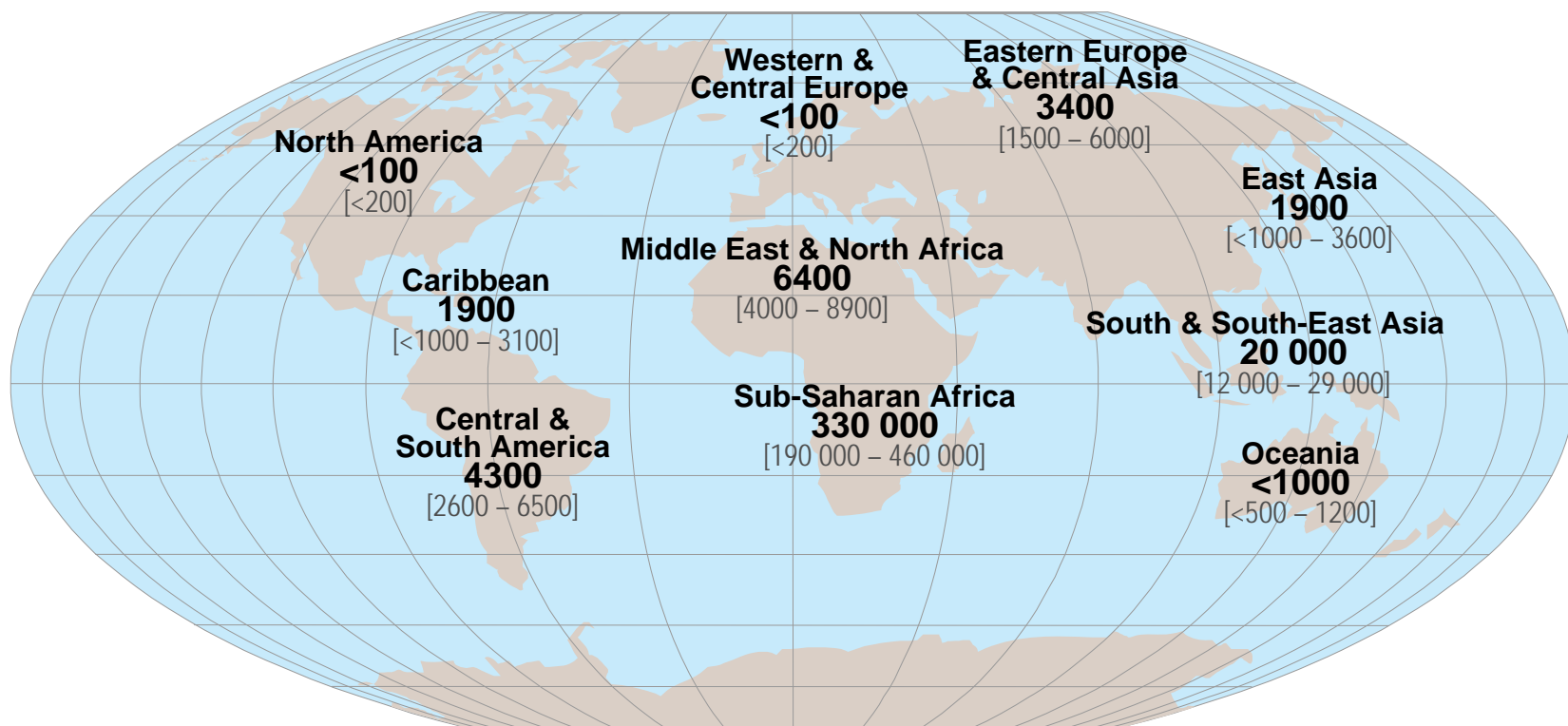

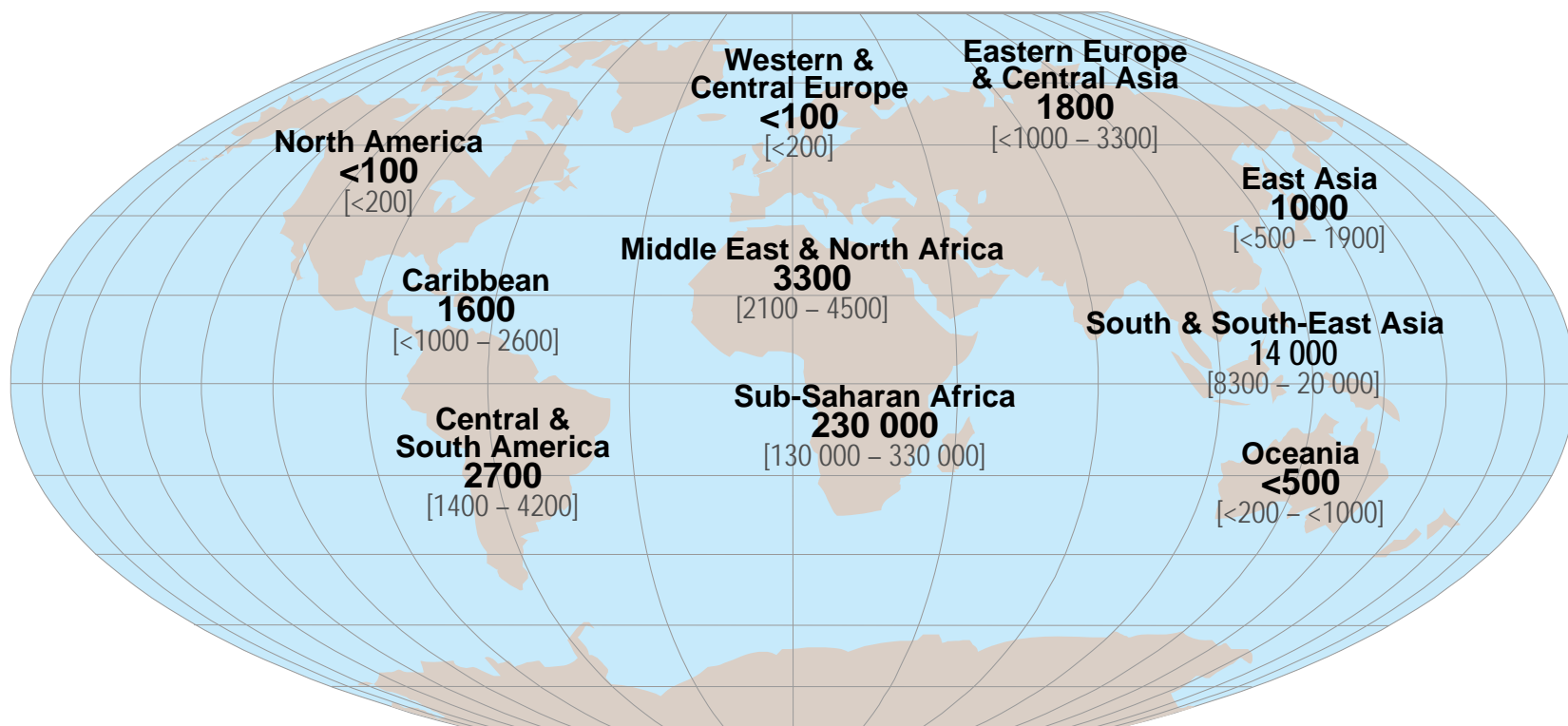

## **Over 7000 new HIV infections a day in 2009**

- **About 97% are in low and middle income countries**
- **About 1000 are in children under 15 years of age**
- **About 6000 are in adults aged 15 years and older, of whom:**
  - almost 51% are among women
  - about 41% are among young people (15-24)
