Goal 3 Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages

3.3 By 2030 end the epidemics of AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, and neglected tropical diseases and combat hepatitis, water-borne diseases, and other communicable diseases

UNGA September 2014 Welcomed the OWG Report and declared that it "shall be the main basis for integrating sustainable development goals into the post-2015 development agenda, while recognizing that other inputs will also be considered"



UN Secretary-General's Synthesis Report: The Road to Dignity by 2030

- 2015 a unique year in the history of UN
- Reflects on lessons learned
- Framework for a new agenda
 - 8 principles that together can bring about a universal transformation of sustainable development
 - 6 essential elements for delivering the SDGs
- Calls for eradication of malaria and the realization of a future free from AIDS and TB
