35th PCB - Dec 2014: Decision points on post-2015

- Reaffirms its [commitment to ending AIDS epidemic](#) as a public health threat by 2030... and welcomes SDG target 3.3 to ‘by 2030 end the epidemics of AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria...’ ;
- Encourages Member States to [advocate for the decisions of the Board](#) to be reflected in the final documents on the post-2015 agenda;
- Recognizes that ending the AIDS epidemic by 2030 [can only be achieved if no one is left behind](#) and therefore encourages Member States to advocate for a sustainable transformative, inclusive and ambitious post-2015 development agenda;
- Recognizes need to assess the ability of the UN system to respond to post-2015 challenges and emphasizes [value of the experience of the Joint Programme](#), e.g. multisectoral collaboration, issue-specific partnerships and its inclusive governance model;
- Recognizes that Joint Programme serves as a [useful common platform for accountability](#) for ending the AIDS epidemic.

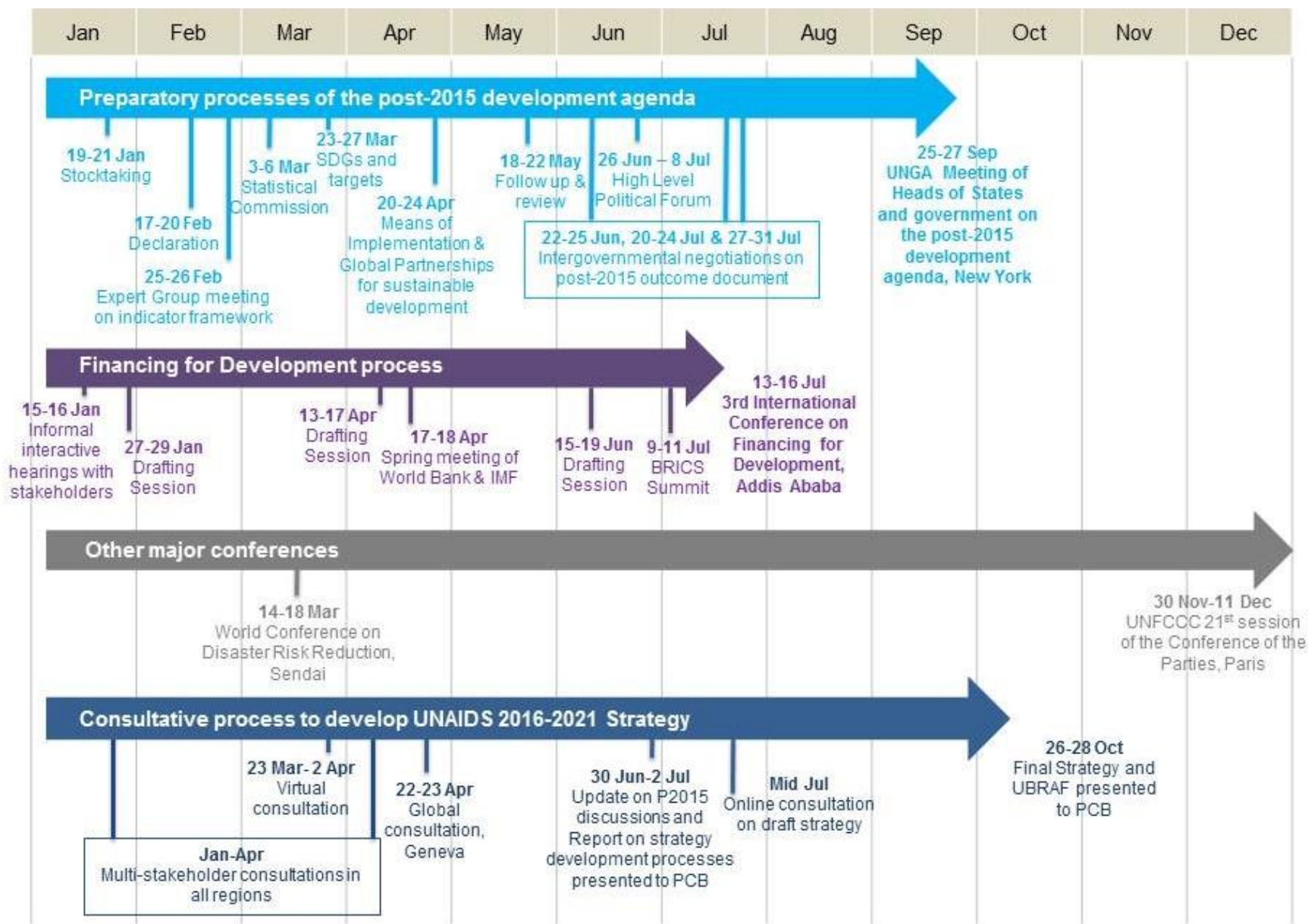

Draft outcome document for UN Summit on post-2015 development agenda (2 June)

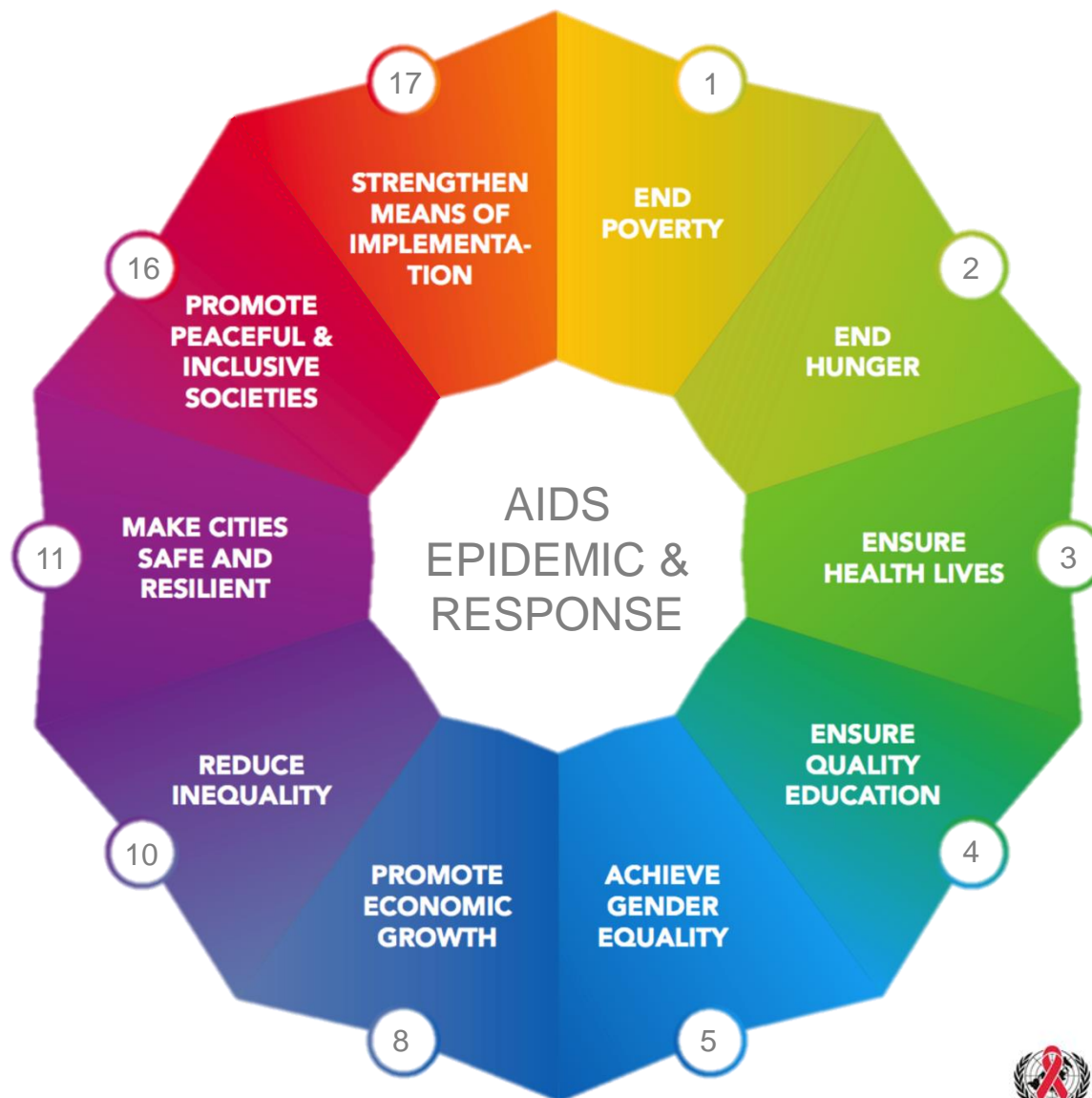
Zero draft of the outcome document for the

Development Agenda

Four sections:

1. Opening Declaration
2. Sustainable Development Goals and Targets
3. Means of Implementation and Global Partnership
4. Follow-up and Review

- Emphasis on **people, planet, prosperity and partnership**
- Proposes a clustering of 17 SDGs into 9 categories

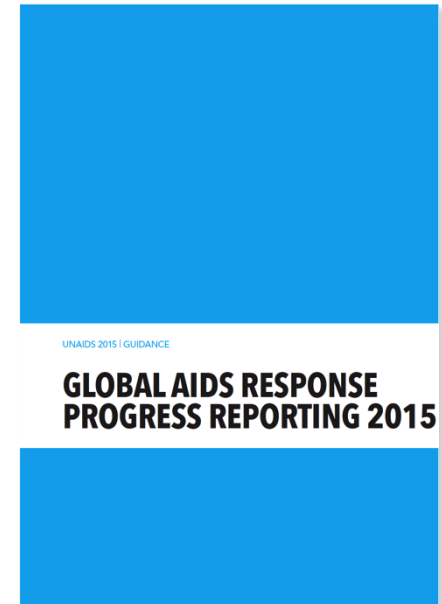
AIDS and SDGs: Joint action, shared progress



Getting to zero

Follow-up and review framework: Lessons from AIDS

- Results-oriented approach of AIDS response relevant for sustainable development agenda
- Work on indicator framework guided by UN Statistical Commission – countries responsible for developing more detailed frameworks
- Need to ensure that national frameworks measure progress on AIDS, including on additional SDGs targets relevant to HIV
- GARPR reporting system remains critical and is being updated



Financing for Development: Draft outcome of Addis Ababa Conference

- FFD track linked to ambition of post-2015 Declaration
- Important implications for AIDS response, including for **front loading investments** to stay on track for 2030 as well as to **diversify financing**
- Member States interested in an Addis outcome that **matches or surpasses level of ambition of SDGs**
- Draft Outcome Document contains **sections on science, technology, innovation and capacity building and data, monitoring and follow-up**
- 'Financing for **sustainable development**' in lieu of 'financing for **development**', marking a critical shift to a universal and sustainable agenda
