Report on the consultative process to update and extend the UNAIDS 2011-2015 Strategy

30 June 2015

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At its 35th meeting, the PCB requested:

"the Executive Director to undertake a multistakeholder consultative process to update and extend the UNAIDS 2011-2015 Strategy through the fast track period 2016-2021...taking into account the 2011 Political Declaration on HIV and AIDS and ongoing discussions on the post-2015 Sustainable Development Goals, and report back on this process at the 36th PCB."

Consultation objectives

- Generate shared understanding of epidemic priorities, opportunities and challenges of new context, how to accelerate progress
- Design a consultative process accessible to as many different stakeholders as possible
- Be in "listening mode" hear from stakeholders

What we have learned: Stakeholder priorities

- 1 Prioritize a rapid reduction in new HIV infections
- 2 Focus the response: location / population
- 3 Empower women & girls and ensure gender equality
- 4 Amplify human rights leadership of the AIDS response
- 5 Front-load, scale up and diversify investment
- 6 Seek opportunities to strategically integrate the response

... All of which serve to ensure that no one is left behind and everyone who needs them can access HIV-related services

Regional consultations

- Cost-effective
- Methods varied: National and regional face-to-face; virtual
- All engaged Member States, Cosponsors, Civil Society and international and regional partners







Virtual consultation

- Aim to enable broader, more diverse engagement
- Four discussion for a including one on youth in partnership with the PACT
- 280 inputs; 50 countries; 5 languages

Structuring the conversation: Guiding questions


- How will developments global and regional impact the epidemic and response in countries and at the sub-national level over the coming years?
- Who is being left behind and why? Where are the main challenges and gaps? What achievements in addressing challenges to date should be expanded and built upon?
- In order to reach the Fast-Track targets, what should be the strategic priorities in the response?
- What will need to change in support of those priorities? What are the "game-changers"?
- How can the opportunity of the new Sustainable Development Goals be optimized in the Strategy – what linkages, policy coherence and collaborative action must be pursued?
- What are the most critical ways in which the Joint Programme can support efforts to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030?

Structuring the conversation: Draft strategic framework



End the AIDS epidemic by 2030

+ Contribute to SDGs on healthy lives; inclusive quality education; gender equality; reducing inequality; decent work; peaceful and inclusive societies



Bringing it all together

- Synthesis of outcomes presented in Board paper
- On the basis of synthesis, a preliminary outline is presented as annex
- Aims to facilitate discussion at PCB
- Focuses more on overarching narrative and major priorities rather than specific actions



Next steps

- Following this PCB, intensive drafting period
- Late July first draft available
- 2nd virtual consultation will be held to review draft
- Final strategy will presented to 37th PCB, October 2015
