


#### Adults and children estimated to be living with HIV | 2014


# Estimated number of adults and children newly infected with HIV | 2014


#### Estimated adult and child deaths from AIDS | 2014


#### Children (<15 years) estimated to be living with HIV | 2014


# Estimated number of children (<15 years) newly infected with HIV | 2014

#### About 5,600 new HIV infections a day in 2014

- About 66% are in Sub Saharan Africa
- About 600 are in children under 15 years of age
- About 5,000 are in adults aged 15 years and older, of whom:
  - almost 48% are among women
  - about 30% are among young people (15-24)
