




## The King's birthday cultural norm and the Annual Kabaka Birthday run

- A platform to sensitise people on HIV Prevention, Testing, ARV uptake, discouraging stigma
- Started with 1,000 participants in 2014 to 80,000 in 2022 [2023 : 100,000; 2024 : 120,000, 2025 : 150,000]
- □ 2014-2017 : Fistula theme
- 2017-2019: Sickle cells theme
- □2020 2022: 'Men are stars' in the HIV fight to save the girl child
- □ 2023 2025 : HIV campaign to continue



- Deployed to create awareness, and advocacy and prevention of HIV/AIDS. In a day we have 174 'byooto' &find men and youth in their localities.
- HIV/AIDS prevention messages have been disseminated using the cultural structures; Masaza(Counties), Magombolola (sub-counties) Miruka (parishes) and Byalo-Batongole (Village).



The traditional administrative units (18 Masaza/counties + 52 Clans) football Tournaments

- Attracts over 30,000 fans 'Buganda wide', provides direct audience to disseminate HIV fight messages to men and youth
- We find Men and Youth in their environments with the same messages





#### The traditional annual King's Canoe Regatta (18 Masaza / Counties & 52 Clans) competitions

- Attracts over 10,000 fans, provides direct audience to disseminate HIV fight messages to men and youth.
- Competitions put up to find Men and youth in their environments

# Some negative cultural norms and beliefs 'modified' due to prevalence of HIV

 Cementing brotherhood through blood contact with the use of coffee beans (Okutta omukago)

 Celebrating the birth of Twins (Initiation ceremonies)



### The Impact

This approach has significantly improved HIV- Cultural- related behaviors in Buganda Kingdom between 2016 and 2020 including;

Increased knowledge of HIV status from 89% to 94%,

Increased HIV treatment coverage from 64% to 92%.

A 52% decrease in new HIV Infections.
