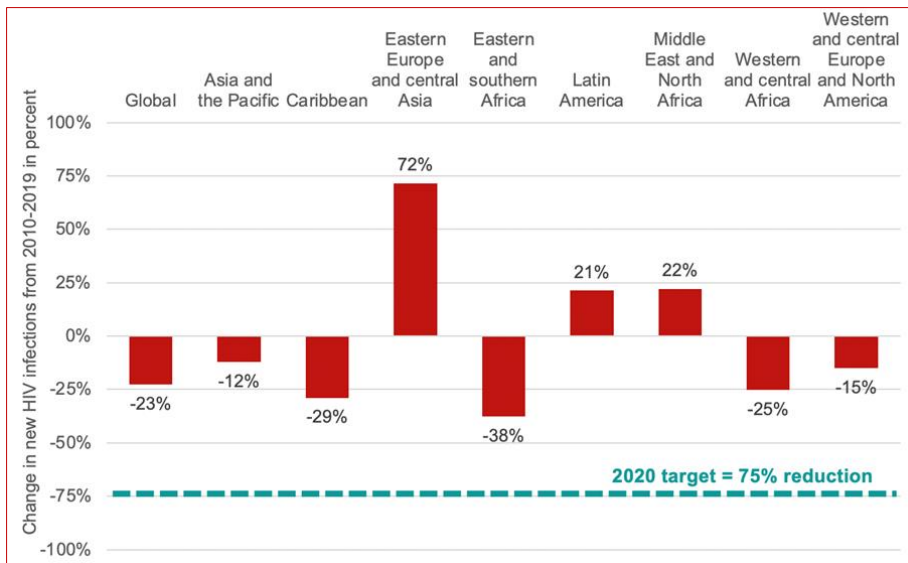

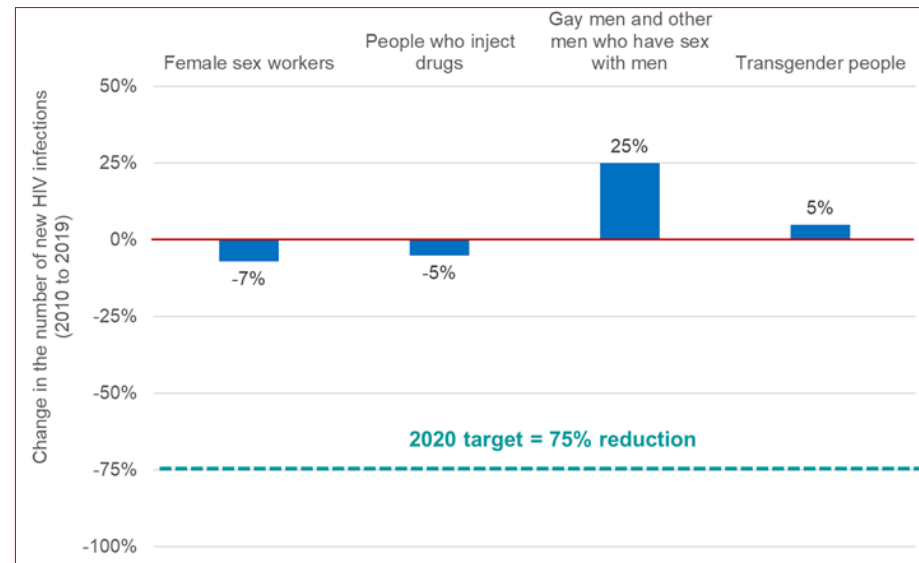
# There were 1.7 million new HIV infections in 2019

- This is the lowest number of new HIV infections recorded since 1989
- Still 3 times higher than the Fast-track target: **lower than 500'000** by 2020

## Progress in reducing new HIV infections is uneven between regions

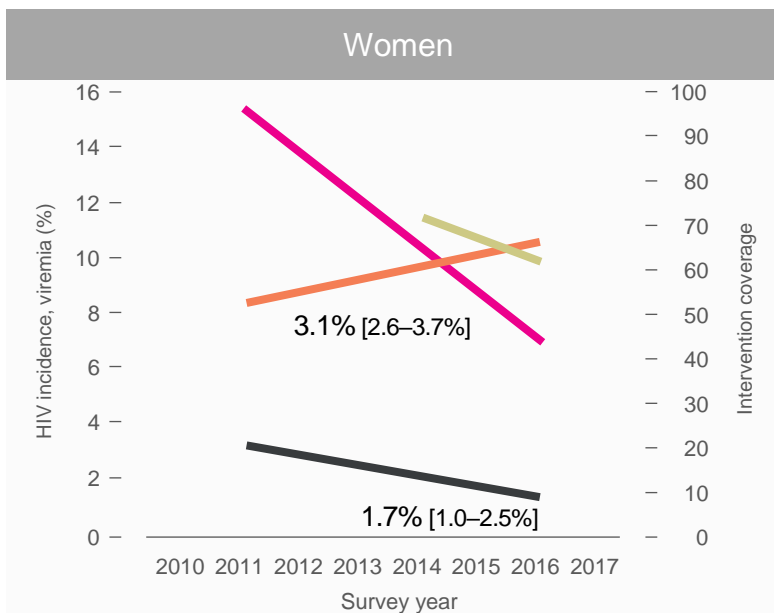
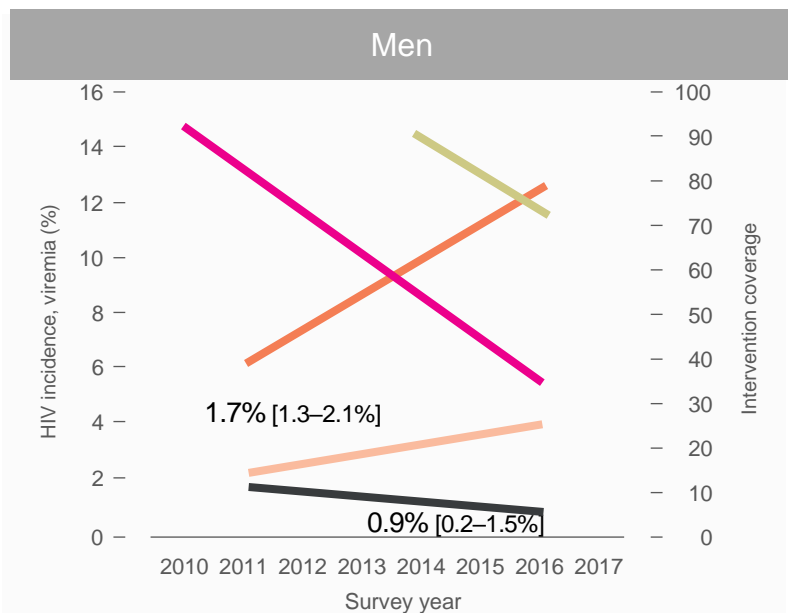


## Lack of progress is driven by failures in addressing Key Population epidemics

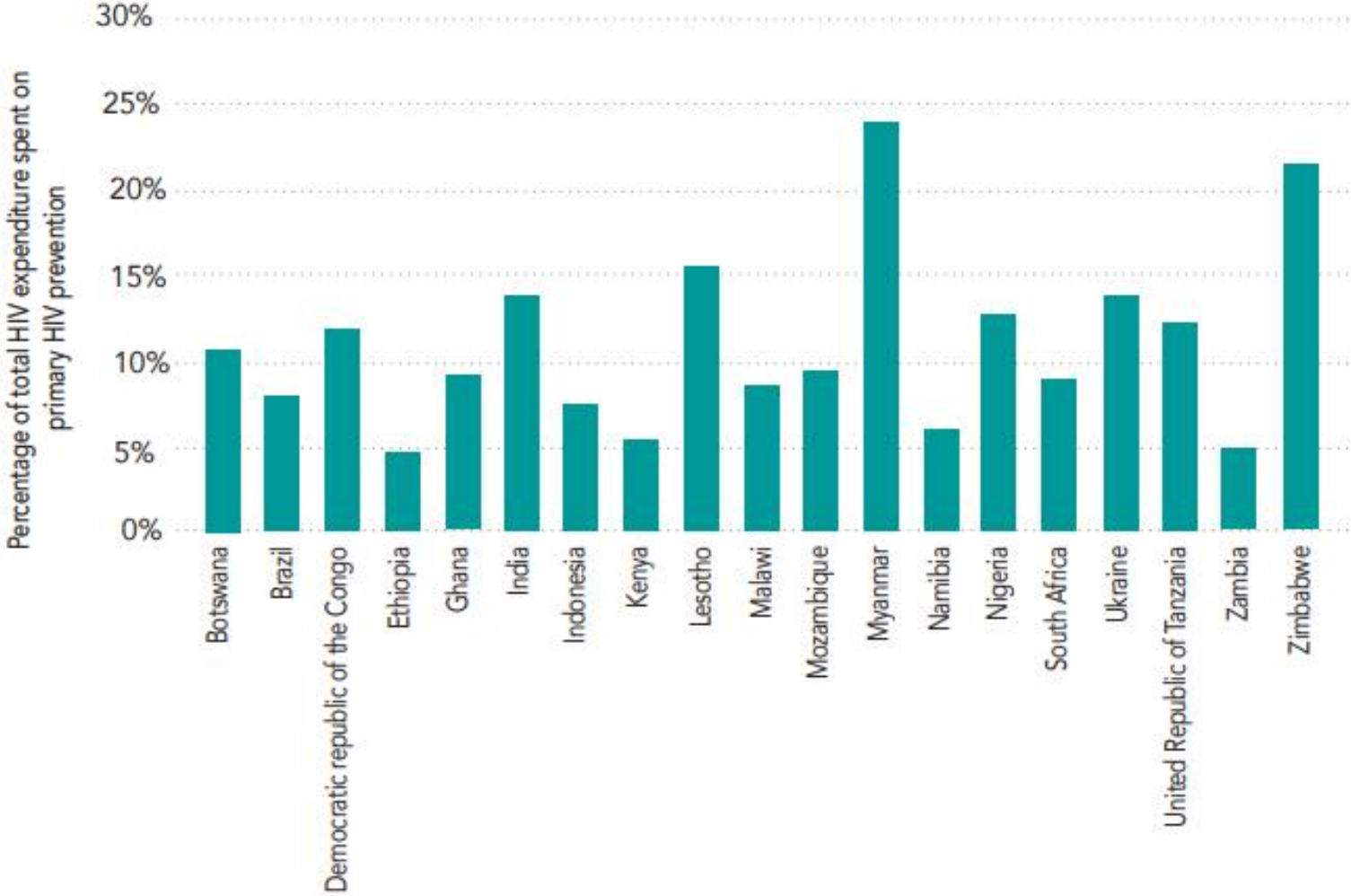
