A new target has been set to end the AIDS epidemic by 2030 as part of the Sustainable Development Goals. For the world to achieve this target, countries must Fast-Track access to health services for women and adolescent girls, including access to medicines to prevent mother-to-child transmission, HIV prevention services and treatment for all.

This high-level side event hosted by Panama, which holds a Vice-Presidency of the World Health Assembly, will highlight the challenges women and adolescent girls face and the innovations needed in prevention and treatment technologies, service delivery, financing and programming to end the AIDS epidemic by 2030.
